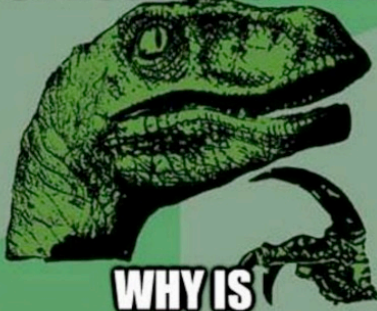

Historical Thanksgiving Facts

- Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November in the USA.
- Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the second Monday in October in Canada.

- They celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day in the fall of 1621.

- The state of New York officially made Thanksgiving Day an annual custom in 1817.
- The annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade tradition began in the 1920's.
- Californians are the largest consumers of turkey in the USA.
- By the fall of 1621 only half of the pilgrims, who had sailed on the Mayflower, survived. The survivors, thankful to be alive, decided to hold a thanksgiving feast.

"The total project cost was \$265,836.00. For Pelly this is a great accomplishment for our tax base is not large. The cost to the Village of Pelly was \$104,141.00. A savings account was started back in 1998 and after 11 years totaled \$42,716.00, all of this money was designated to this project. The remainder of The Village of Pelly, cost was \$59,425.00 and this amount was budgeted over a few years. Council did this with a minimal amount of tax increases. A large portion of the project which totaled \$161,695.00 was funded by a combination of federal and provincial grants, namely New Deal Funding, The Building Canada Fund and MEEP which stands for Municipal Economic Enhancement Program."
